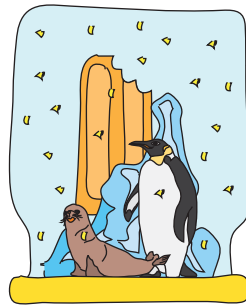
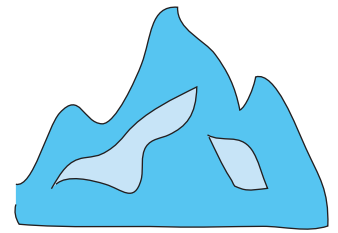


MAKE YOUR OWN ANTARCTIC SNOWGLOBE



DID YOU KNOW?

It doesn't actually snow very often in Antarctica. Antarctica is a desert!



MATERIALS

- This template for the snowglobe figures
- An A4 laminating sleeve OR clear contact paper OR clear packing tape
- A small jar – plastic or glass – at least 9–10 cm tall with the lid on
- Some glitter
- Sticky tape

INSTRUCTIONS

Step 1

Cut out the figures and background you want to use from this template.

Step 2

Use laminating papers and a laminator (or a household iron will also do the trick) to laminate your figures so they are waterproof.

If you don't have laminating sheets you could use clear packaging tape or contact to cover each side of the figures. Ensure there is a margin of clear tape/laminate around the edge to keep your pictures sealed up tight.

Step 3

Cut out around your laminated figures leaving a small margin of clear on each edge.

Step 4

Arrange your scene using sticky tape to position inside the jar. Remember the lid will be at the bottom of the globe, so your scene is upside down right now.

If you prefer, you can stick your figures standing up on the jar lid. Make sure you leave a margin of space around the edge for the lid to screw on.

Step 5.

Once your scene is done, add half a teaspoon of glitter (not too much or you will have a blizzard!) and fill to the brim of the jar with water.

Screw the lid on tightly.

Step 6

Your beautiful Antarctic snowglobe is done.

Now all there is to do is shake it!
